

**How to use this devotional:**

Begin your devotional time with prayer, specifically seeking God's wisdom in understanding and applying the scripture for the day.

Read the passage for the day 2-3 times so that you become familiar with it.

Read through the questions and then read the passage once more thinking about how it answers the questions. (not all of the questions have answers that are found in the passage)

Write out your answers to the questions.

Write down any other thoughts or questions that you have about the passage.

Spend some time in prayer, worshipping God for who he is and what you've learned about him, as well as confessing sin and praying for specific prayer requests.

What fruit is Jesus referring to in this passage?

How do we remain/abide in Jesus?

What is significant about Christ's command in verse 12 relative to verse 13?

How does the relationship of friends differ from the relationship of a master to his servant?

What did God's love accomplish?

Review what you've learned in the last 30 days. How is God's love described?

Why does God love people?

What is significant about God's love?

**Day 31:** I Thessalonians 1

What is significant about the Thessalonians' love?

Review what you've learned in the last 30 days. Who are we supposed to love?

Why should we be loving them?

How would you define agape?

**Day 32:** I Corinthians 12:12-31

What do Christians all have in common with each other?

Why does Paul give examples of body parts saying that they don't belong or don't need other body parts?

How does this passage relate to chapter 13?

Review your study from day 4. How does this passage change your responses?

**Day 33:** Colossians 1:3-23

What is the source of the Colossians' love?

Why is Jesus worthy of our worship?

What is significant about Jesus being the head of the body, if we are the body?

How is the picture of a body different from what you normally think of as a church?

**Day 34:** Romans 12:1-21

Why does Paul refer to our lives as living sacrifices?

How do verses 3-21 relate to knowing God's will?

What does love among the body look like?

Who is someone that you would like to get even with? What does Paul tell us to do to people like that?

How are we to treat each other in the church?

What is the end goal of our unity?

How did Jesus Christ accept us?
